<u>Ambizione grants</u> are aimed at young researchers who wish to conduct, manage and lead an independent project at a Swiss higher education institution. The submission deadline is November 1, 2019.

PRIMA

<u>PRIMA grants</u> are aimed at outstanding researchers who have great potential to become professors in their future career.

- Jessica Schäper started her PhD in the group for Magnetic Resonance Physics and Methodology (MRPM), lead by Prof. Oliver Bieri. She did her Master of Science in Physics, at the Albert-Ludwigs-Universität in Freiburg i.Br. The focus of her PhD project mainly lies on relaxometry in magnetic resonance imaging.
- Mohamad Awchiwi started his PhD in the group for Translational Medicine Breath Research of Prof. Pablo Sinues. Originally he is from the Netherlands, where he obtained his bachelors in Chemistry. Hereafter he went to Stockholm for his master's in Analytical Chemistry. For his PhD, he will be analysing human breath for medical diagnosis using mass spectrometry.
